1) ABATTOIR: SEWERAGE RATES (from 1 July 2026)

An abattoir sewerage tariff in respect of private abattoirs is determined as follows to provide for the higher volume of water:

- a) Grid well for catching water on slaughter floor, Beds, and water room floor.

- b) That where detritus traps need to be repaired or replaced, an additional tariff of R2 810.80 per month will be payable in respect of abattoirs.

12. EXEMPTIONS, REDUCTIONS AND REBATES

The first R15 000,00 of the market value as per the valuation Roll on Residential Properties as set out in Section 17(1)(h) of the MPRA is exempted from paying property rates and R 100 000 for all residential property with a market value less than R190 000 reduction determined in the Rates Policy.

Rebates in respect of a category of owners of property are as follows:

NATIONAL MONUMENT / HERITAGE PROPERTY REBATE

In context of the Municipal Property Rates Policy a National Monument / Heritage Property means:

"Property used primarily for the preservation and protection of heritage resources and formally declared or protected under applicable national or provincial heritage legislation, including former national monuments and heritage sites recognized by the relevant authority."

Recognizing the public benefit associated with the preservation and protection of heritage resources, the Municipality may grant a rebate of 15% on rates levied in respect of qualifying National Monument / Heritage Properties. Such rebate shall apply to the property being levied in accordance with its applicable category of use as determined in terms of Section 8 of the Local Government: Municipal Property Rates Act, 2004 (Act 6 of 2004) and Section 6 of this Policy. The rebate shall apply to the property based on its approved category of use and not as a separate property category. The granting of the rebate shall be subject to the property being formally declared or protected by the relevant competent authority and the submission of any supporting documentation required by the Municipality.

AGRICULTURAL

As a result of, and considering, limited rate-funded services supplied to such properties in general, the contribution of agriculture to the local economy, the extent to which agriculture assists in meeting the service delivery and development obligations of the community, and the contribution of agriculture to the social and economic welfare of farm workers, the council bills a reduced rate (as set out below) in respect of properties subject to agricultural use.

This rate rebate is 91% of the rate levied on Residential Properties, which rate on properties subject to agricultural use does not exceed the maximum ratio to the rate on Residential Property prescribed in the MPRA Rate Ratio Regulations.

The council will, when it imposes rates and sets tariffs for the budget year, grant an additional rebate of 65% on the rates payable in respect of agricultural properties where –

- there are no municipal roads next to the property;
- there is no municipal sewerage to the property;
- there is no municipal electricity to the property;
- water is not supplied by the municipality;
- refuse removal is not provided by the municipality.

No other rebates will be granted to properties that qualify for the Agricultural rebate. For the avoidance of doubt properties that qualify for the agricultural rebate will not be entitled to the residential rate rebate.

Pensioners

Registered owners of Residential Properties who are pensioners qualify for special rebates according to gross monthly household income of all Pensioners permanently residing on that property. To qualify for the rebate a property owner must be the registered owner of a property which satisfies the requirements of the definition of residential Property. This property owner must on 1 July of the financial year:

- Occupy the property as his/her Primary Residence, and
- Be at least 60 years of age, or
- Has been declared medically unfit even if not yet 60 years of age, and
- Be in receipt of a gross monthly household income not exceeding the amount determined by Council during the Municipality's budgeted process.
- Must annually submit proof to the CFO that he or she is registered with the Department of Social Development as a recipient of an old age or disability grant.

- i) Accessibility fees on undeveloped ERVEN 200 m and larger are charged only where the service is available, where the erven border a street front and where there is a sufficient street front to place a building.
- ii) When the electricity or water supply to an erf is shut off for any reason and thus remains close for a continuous period of six months, availability fees are charged from the first day of the month immediately following the expiry of the six months.
- iii) In the event that the owner of an erven who pays the basic minimum fee is subsequently provided with a connection to the water or electricity supply, the availability fee ceases from the commencement of the ordinary service fee.
- iv) The City Engineer is authorized to charge availability fees in accordance with the provision of the applicable by-law and considering existing policies of the Council.
- v) The fees payable to the Council on a monthly basis by the owner of any property that is not connected to the electricity or water supply as well as the sewerage network of the Council, but which in the opinion of the Council can reasonably be connected in this way, as well as owners of prepaid meters who does not buy water is determined by the Council by Special Resolution.

If a building plan is submitted for the erection of a building after such building has already been erected or is in the process of erection, or if construction work is commenced before the plan has been approved in this regard by the local authority, a fine equal to four times the amount prescribed in respect of such plan must be paid, provided that the minimum penalty fine in respect of each building plan is R315.62 and the maximum fine of each such plan is R1,545.27 in addition to the ordinary fees as in 19a) above.

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22.SERVICE CONNECTIONS

The following fees are payable to the Council with effect from 1 July 2026 in respect of three-phases or single-phase underground service connections.

- (i) Where the power supply to a premise is provided with only one consumer, R33 925.88 for a three-phase connection and R31 263.31 for a single-phase connection excluding VAT, provided that where special equipment or heavier conductors require or require 10mm is deemed. Or where another route is required longer than determined by the Electrotechnical Engineer, the full cost such connection is recovered from the applicant based on actual cost of materials, up to a maximum of 40 meters, thereafter R575.08 p/m, Excluding VAT, extra, labor and supervision plus 20% in respect of administrative costs, consisting of labor and tool rent, but only 2½% on the cost of material.

- (ii) Where a power supply to a premise with more than one consumer is provided:

AND

Where special equipment or heavier conductors than 10 mm are required or deemed necessary or where a different route, longer than that determined by the electrical Engineer, is required, full cost of such connection based on the actual cost of material, labor, and supervision plus 20% administrative cost in respect of labor and tool rent, but only 2½% on the cost of materials, with a minimum payment of R33 925.87 per three-phase, excluding VAT and R31 263.31 per single phase, excluding VAT.

The existing policy regarding the replacement of the same or multiphase supply remains unchanged.

Reconnection of Electricity Meters: R 380.24 (Credit Control)

- (iii) That an overhead service connection tariff be accepted for R6 877.18 which excludes VAT which will only apply to a single phase overhead 10 mm connection, provided that where heavier conductors than 10 mm are required or deemed necessary, a maximum of 16 mm will be allowed at actual cost with an administrative levy of 20% and 25% levy on materials.
- (iv) That if another route is required than by the Engineer or his proxy, the full cost of such connection shall be recovered from the applicant, based on actual cost of materials, up to a maximum of 30 meters, thereafter R153.36 p/m extra, excluding VAT, labor, and supervision plus 20% in respect of administrative cost, consisting of labor and and tool rent, but only 2.5% on the cost of materials.

- (v) Where ervens are consolidated and subdivided or where more than one connection per erven is required, an amount of R11 068.02, excluding VAT will be payable per connection as a contribution to the capital fund of the electrical network, provided that where more than twelve (12) connections are required, costs will be calculated according to the attached schedule.

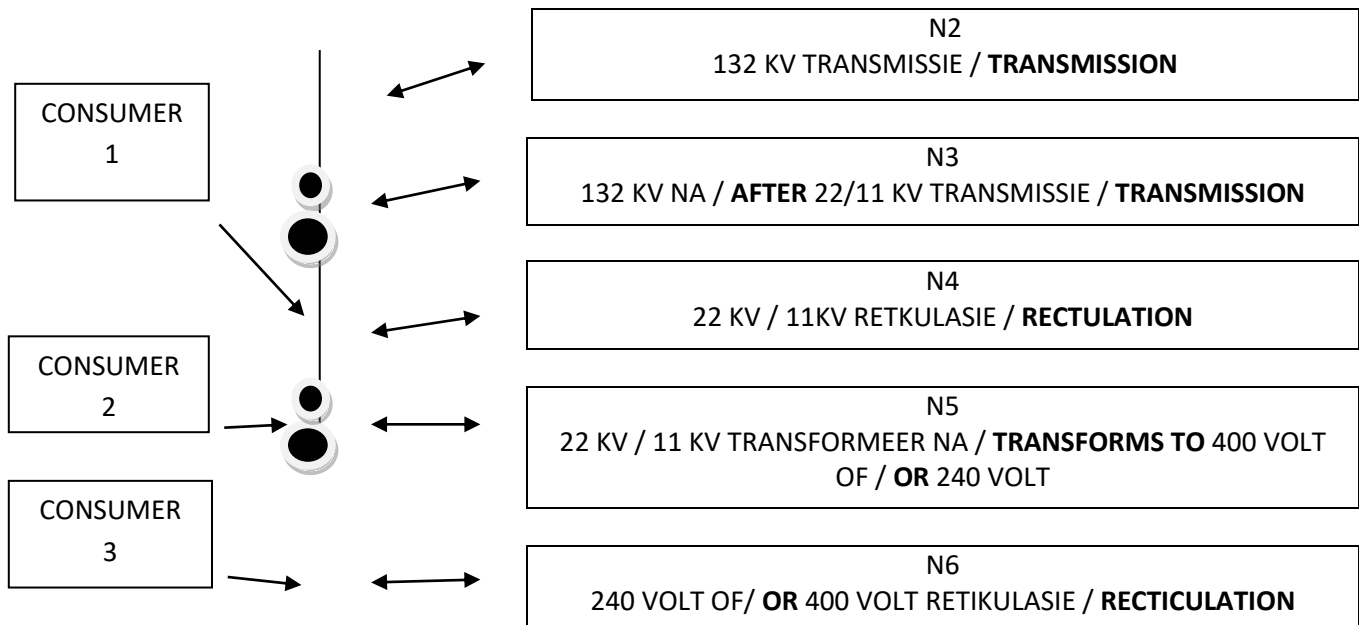

The model determines the monthly water consumption versus water availability and makes recommendations on which Phase of Restrictions are required.

A flat rate structure for consumers where consumption is not measured and a water prepaid meter or conventional meter has been bypassed, removed, or damaged will be levied a water flat rate equivalent to water availability charge.
